





THE LAUNCH OF THE HOSPITAL COLLABORATIVE: A FOCUS ON POPULATION HEALTH

In March 2015 Health & Disability Advocates (HDA) with the Chicago Department of Public Health (CDPH) released a report which summarized the common priorities emerging out of the ACA-required Community Health Needs Assessments (CHNAs) of 27 Chicago hospitals.



Chicago Hospitals & the ACA: More Opportunities for Prevention highlighted the top shared priorities from hospital CHNAs and illustrated the overlap in the service areas of these providers. The findings revealed significant opportunities for collaboration among hospitals and with hospitals and other partners. The following month, more than 20 charitable hospitals were convened by HDA and CDPH and learned about the opportunities for having a collective impact on population health in Chicago. They also heard from senior staff from the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention who provided the national context for Chicago's efforts.

HOSPITALS COMMIT TO HEALTH PRIORITIES

At its June, 2015 meeting, the Collaborative adopted a charter to guide their work. The charter identified the primary functions of the group. These include:

- Leveraging opportunities for collaboration across hospitals and between hospitals and other public health stakeholders;
- Promoting a space for shared learning;
- Providing technical support for implementing priority actions;
- Promoting sharing of data and other resources;
- Monitoring and reporting on implementation of Collaborative efforts, and;
- Evaluating progress, impacts, lessons learned, and challenges and successes of the Collaborative.

The *Chicago Hospitals & the ACA* report focused on the most frequently identified priorities emerging from the first round of CHNAs. Collaborative members agreed to work collectively to address three of these:

OBESITY




MENTAL HEALTH

Workgroups have been established for each priority area and each began meeting in September. As they refine their foci on specific projects, community and other partners will be engaged for implementation. Future reports will include updates on these efforts.

WEBSITE LAUNCH

IMPROVED ACCESS TO POPULATION HEALTH DATA

Healthy Chicago Hospital Collaborative has partnered with the Smart Chicago Collaborative to make community health data more accessible to hospitals and other stakeholders. While the Smart Chicago Collaborative's Chicago Health Atlas has had both community health data and hospital data available in the past, through this partnership population health data will now be linked to the hospital. These enhancements are being overseen by the Hospital Collaborative's Data Workgroup and are expected to be completed by the end of 2015.

Among the data available through the Chicago Health Atlas are indicators related to:

- Demographics
- Births
- Deaths
- Chronic Disease
- Crime
- Health Insurance

It is anticipated that hospitals will use these data both to better understand the needs of the communities they serve and for monitoring the impact of their individual and collaborative efforts.
